Treasurer's Report

The accountant has been paid for last year's tax report.

Doris is planning to contact the IRS, as \$6400.00 were removed from the club's bank account due to late fees in 2019. Doris explained that this amount seems too high, and in similar situations in the past, she has persisted and received money back for the club.

Doris acquired a credit card for club members to use for club business. It has a \$1000.00 limit, and this has been difficult to stay under. Doris is planning to get another credit card from the bank after the show and bump up the limit to \$2500.00. This will help limit the use of the ATM card.

This year, the club will be using a different accountant for taxes. (This has been Doris's personal accountant for the last 30 years.)

Miscellaneous Discussion

Doris will not be setting up her beautiful club spot in the main building for the show this year.

Jordan Key will be coming to the show grounds to play some festive, upbeat songs on the bagpipes before groups and before best in show. He is not able to perform the national anthem (due to the limited range of the bagpipes), so the club will proceed with the traditional recording from previous years.

Jeremy purchased 5 total heaters for the show, and he will be purchasing the propane tanks for each in the coming weeks.

Doris has made several club-related trips in the last couple of months, and the board voted to reimburse her \$45.00 for gas.

Jeremy will be making two new signs for the raffle basket tables at the show.

Marge moved to adjourn the board meeting, Susan seconded. Board meeting adjourned at 7:25pm.
